Nahant Life Saving Station (NLSS)

- We made some structural repairs in the hall floor and installed a new tile floor.
- We replaced an AC unit for the Veterans' area.
- The damaged beach fencing was removed and replaced with more environmentally-friendly dune fencing. Funding for this

- project was provided from the Community Preservation Act (CPA).
- After two difficult seasons due to COVID, Lynda Fields, our new event manager, completed a very successful season of boat room event rentals, proceeds from which help maintain our buildings and grounds.
- The Trust hosted a Memorial Day exhibit curated by Robert Wilson. "Parade of Honor" included photos of Nahant veterans and town events from 2003-2021.
- We are pleased and grateful that the American Legion and its
 Auxiliary are partnering with us by helping to raise funds for the
 replacement of the weathered and worn Boat Room doors.

Nahant Community Center (Valley Road)

- Thanks to a generous grant from Eastern Bank, we restored the Council on Aging (COA) room floor.
- We are consulting with Mass Save to help us improve our heating and cooling efficiency.
- Some of the aging trees in the parking area were trimmed or removed to prevent damage to property.
- We increased NCC room rentals for small parties. The renovated Sears room and the 2nd floor Serenity Room are available for community use such as meetings or private

parties. Book through Lynda Fields via our <u>website</u>. Special rates for community groups are available.

Open Space (Furbush Road) / Open Space (East Point)

- The NPT continued to support the Town of Nahant in its efforts
 to maintain the beauty of historic East Point as Open Space and
 will continue to do so. Member contributions are welcome and
 greatly appreciated toward this vital effort.

- At the Life Saving Station, we plan to acquire and install new Boat Room doors with a mix of American Legion, NPT, & CPA funding, and continue to improve marketing of the Station to increase event rentals.
- We hope to paint the garage, and continue work on restoring the Tower Room.
- At Valley Road, we hope to increase event activity using the newlyrenovated Sears Room and the Serenity room. We will work on an overall heating/cooling plan with Mass Save, address exterior painting and window repair, and work on an updated landscaping plan.
- Open Space at East Point: we will continue to work for a positive resolution as part of our mission to protect open space.
